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Exit point (IPC) – International Wing



It was a captivating scene, as the students of the International Wing celebrated the culmination of their learning journey through the exit-point for the unit of work: 'Super-Humans'.

Through this unit of work, the students learnt a great deal about the Human-body and it was interesting to see how they shared their learning with the visitors.

The wing was literally converted into a super-speciality hospital, where each classroom was converted into different departments: OPD, Wellness Centre, Ophthalmology & Orthopedic Ward (Centre) and a causality ward. Students were dressed-up as doctors, nurses, fitness-experts, engaged in varied role-plays and conducting physical examinations of the visitors. The visitors felt enthralled to get an eye-check up or receive first-aid.

Students, as professional doctors, checked the heart-beat, pulse and body temperature of the visitors and issued fitness-report cards. The fitness experts gave advice on healthy eating habits and suggested exciting exercise regime. The causality ward showcased an array of role-plays like giving a CPR and maintaining a healthy digestive system.

In totality, it was a delightful and gripping experience for both the students and the visitors who participated with equal zest in celebrating the learning journey of the students. It was indeed a revelation of the philosophy underlying the IPC curriculum, as to how the learning through the unit of work transforms the participants into confident teachers themselves.

We are happy to announce that your Manav Sthali School continues its journey of internationalism. After much thought & research, school has decided to ensure a better foundation for the students to help them nurture into successful beings. For the same, school has introduced International Primary Curriculum (IPC), from UK in the school's International Primary wing.

The IPC is one of the fastest-growing curriculum choices in the world today, with over 1,800 schools in over 90 different countries. It is an inspiring and a comprehensive curriculum for 3-12 year olds, made up of over 130 exciting, engaging and globally relevant thematic units of work, which are designed around improving learning in three ways: academically, personally and internationally.

At the heart of the IPC is the growing bank of over 130 thematic units. The units are based around exciting themes which will keep our children motivated through the learning of Science, Geography, and History and so on. It will also allow them to make purposeful links and connections throughout their learning and to see how their subject learning is related to the world they live in. Within each theme, there are suggestions for collaborative learning, for active learning, for learning outside the classroom, for role play, and for children learning from each other.

The IPC Learning Goals are the foundation of the IPC. The IPC Learning Goals define what children are expected to know, what they should be able to do, and the understandings they will develop in their academic, personal and international learning. These learning goals guide learning and teaching and help to focus assessment. There are three types of Learning Goals:

Subject Learning Goals that cover the knowledge, skills and understanding that children should learn in Science, History, Geography, ICT, Technology, Music, Art, PE, Society and International. The IPC's International Learning Goals help children begin the move towards an increasingly sophisticated national, international, global and intercultural perspective and develop a sense of "international mindedness".

The Personal learning goals refer to those individual qualities and dispositions we believe children will find essential in the 21st century. There are eight IPC



personal goals: enquiry, resilience, morality, communication, thoughtfulness, co-operation, respect and adaptability.

All the above learning goals will help us in achieving our schools mission of nurturing students into empathetic responsible global citizens.

With its own Assessment for Learning Programme, the IPC provides immediate support for teachers and learners through its comprehensive design and rigour, whilst being flexible enough for our school to adapt the planning and build on our own strengths.

Our teachers have been trained for IPC in a very productive 3 days training programme by Ms Sarah Blackmore, Regional Manager-Asia Pacific from IPC'S Asia Pacific Head-office, Singapore, at our school during early April 2017.

As an IPC member we intend to use the structure and rigour of the IPC to help make our vision a reality, by building on the strengths of our context and country, whilst engaging the passion and enthusiasm of our teachers and children.

We at Manav Sthali School are aiming at infusing IPC in our school to ensure "Great learning, Great teaching and Great fun!"
