1. Goa and Manipur declared COVID free States

1. Is there a new Earth? Scientist at the office of SETI (Search for Extraterrestrial intelligence) recently found a new planet called Kepler-1649C. Using the Kepler Space telescope. The Kepler telescope was launched by NASA to help found planets that are similar to earth. They did it for several reasons ranging from potential discoveries of new homes to discovering aliens. The new earth-like planets have been described as the most similar planet to earth at Seti. The planet looks similar in size to earth but is an Exoplanet meaning it orbits around the stars rather than a sun. Hundreds of similar planets are discovered every year, but so far Kepler 1649C seems like our best bet for our new home.

2. Three astronauts just returned from space on April 17 after a mission that lasted for over 200 days. Jessica Meir and Oleg Skripochka, both had 205 days journeys, while Andrew Morgan was in space for 272 days.
