Fake healer dupes woman of ₹1.14L

NEW DELHI: A 40-year-old woman from Chanakyapuri was duped of ₹1.14 lakh by a man posing as a spiritual healer on Instagram. The accused, 23-year-old Rahul Kumar from Rajasthan, used fake profiles and AI-edited images to claim he could remove evil spirits. He was arrested on October 9 for multiple similar frauds.

11kg silver stolen after road rage

NEW DELHI: A 22-year-old man alleged that 11kg of silver was stolen from his bike's storage box following a road rage incident in northeast Delhi's New Usmanpur. The theft occurred after a fight with two men near Jag Pravesh Chandra Hospital. Police are identifying suspects.

NGT junks plea on Barat Ghar

NEW DELHI: The National Green Tribunal has disposed of a plea filed by the residents' welfare association of Commonwealth Games village, which claimed that a barat ghar inside the sports complex was being built without an environmental clearance. It noted that no evidence of violation was presented.

2 held for receiving stolen kalash

NEW DELHI: Delhi Police recovered a gold-plated kalash, worth nearly ₹40 lakh, which was stolen from a Jain temple near Durga Puri Chowk and arrested two scrap dealers from Sundar Nagri and New Mustafabad for receiving stolen property. Police are continuing efforts to trace the burglar who stole the temple relic.

Girl crushed by e-rickshaw in Uttam Nagar, driver held

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NEW DELHI: A five-year-old girl, who was playing outside her grandmother's house in West Delhi's Uttam Nagar, was allegedly killed after a recklessly driven e-rickshaw overturned and fell on her on Sunday afternoon, police said. The accused driver has been arrested.

The victim was identified as Deepanshi Kumari, resident of a slum cluster in the area, and the accused as Murari Jha, a 39-year-old resident of Rannahola.

The officer said that their control room received a call at 4:30 pm regarding an accident in which a minor girl sustained injuries. On reaching the spot, the police were informed that the girl had been taken to Deen Dayal Upadhyay Hospital. At the hospital, the victim's mother, Babita, 32, told police what happened.

"She said that her daughter Deepanshi had gone to her maternal grandmother's house close to theirs and was playing right outside — in a congested lane — when the incident happened," the officer said.

Eye-witnesses said the girl was playing in the street as two e-rickshaws were crossing. "They took a sharp cut and one of them

hit the girl and fell on her. The e-rickshaw was coming from Kali Basti, towards Uttam Nagar. Locals caught hold of the driver and alerted her mother. She then took the child to the hospital where she was declared dead on arrival," the officer said.

Jha was arrested from the spot and a case has been registered for rash and negligent driving and causing death by negligence.

The e-rickshaw has been seized. "My little girl is gone because of a driver who didn't care to

drive properly. These are such congested roads and rickshaws should not even be allowed to drive here as there is not even enough space to walk," said the victim's father, Vishal Kumar. The 33-year-old is a factory worker.

This incident puts focus on the menace of e-rickshaws, which, according to Delhi Traffic Police data for this year (till September 15), have killed 24 people and injured 100 in 108 road accidents. In 2024, there were 20 such fatal

incidents.

In September, a 16-year-old schoolgirl died and three others, including two minor girls, were injured after an e-rickshaw overturned at Paharganj Chowk, allegedly due to the driver's rash and negligent driving. A video of the incident went viral on social media. In May, an eight-year-old girl was allegedly killed after she fell from an e-rickshaw in Harsh Vihar due to alleged rash driving by the 16-year-old driver.

Delhi Traffic Police data further shows that a total of 2,278 e-rickshaws have been impounded this year till September 15, while 432,000 challans have been issued.

Last year, 352,000 challans were issued to e-rickshaws.

Boy, 5, crushed under e-rickshaw in south Delhi

In the second incident, a five-year-old boy, resident of south Delhi's Sangam Vihar, was killed when his friend accidentally started an e-rickshaw parked on the side of lane Sunday afternoon. "A water-delivery e-rickshaw was parked in the lane. It was accidentally started by a child resulting in the victim being run over and getting trapped underneath," the officer said, adding that a case has been registered in the matter.

COPS RECEIVE CALL REPORTING SEXUAL ASSAULT ON STUDENT AT SAU

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NEW DELHI: Police on Monday said they received a call reporting an alleged incident of sexual assault on a student at South Asian University in south Delhi's Maidan Garhi. Officials said they have not yet registered a formal case as the student is yet to file a complaint in the matter.

According to police, the call to PCR was made around 3pm on Monday by the student's friend, who reported the alleged incident. Deputy commissioner of police (South) Ankit Chauhan said the woman is currently being counselled. "Till now, she has not given any formal statement," he said.

An officer familiar with the matter said preliminary inquiries suggest the incident may have occurred on Sunday when the student was alone on campus. "So far, there are no allegations of rape," the officer said, adding that details are still being verified.

The university administration confirmed it was aware of the PCR call and said it is cooperating fully with the investigation. "The police are conducting a thorough investigation into the matter, and the administration is extending full cooperation to the investigating authorities," the university said in a statement.

Deadline for eviction passes: Water, power snapped for 50 flats

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NEW DELHI: A day after the Delhi High Court's deadline to vacate Signature View Apartments in Mukherjee Nagar expired, chaos unfolded on Monday as authorities cut off water and electricity to the remaining residents.

Dozens of residents, many with their belongings half-packed, pleaded with officials for a few days' reprieve. "There are around 50 families. Some were about to leave in four or five days, others after Diwali," said Roopesh Kukreja, a resident of flat B-802.

To be sure, the Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) had warned residents in the last week of September that all essential services would be disconnected from October 13. The move followed a long legal battle over the crumbling complex — developed by the Delhi Development

Authority (DDA) between 2007 and 2009 and allotted by 2011-12 — which has faced severe structural issues for years.

The Delhi High Court had backed DDA's decision to demolish the unsafe buildings, directing officials to ensure minimum inconvenience to residents. But residents appealed to the Supreme Court, which on Friday dismissed their plea, clearing the way for demolition. The top court also gave residents till October 12 to vacate the flats, and made it clear that any continued stay beyond that date would be at the residents' own risk.

Of the 336 flats in the complex, around 50 remained occupied as families struggled to arrange alternate housing.

Kukreja, who has a 10-year-old autistic child, said the sudden service cut had made the move unbearable. "We reached out for political support — the mayor, the local MLA — but got no help," he said.

When HT visited the site on Monday, several residents across 12 blocks were seen appealing to officials not to disconnect power.

"I have managed to get a house on rent nearby, but I'm waiting for the court's approval on the rent agreement, which is scheduled for October 22. We just needed a few more days," said Pawan Dawar, another resident.

Residents said between 30 and 50 flats were still occupied when utilities were snapped.

"Diwali is around the corner, and we're basically homeless," said Preeti Barea of flat F-101. "We didn't mind vacating, but we expected some time till Diwali. I spent over ₹50 lakh on the interiors — now it's all gone."

The Residents Welfare Association (RWA) said it had been trying to ensure a peaceful transition. "Around 30-35 people were in the process of vacating within two or three days," said Gaurav Pandey, RWA general secretary. "Many have offices and children's schools nearby, so finding suitable homes takes time. We were hoping for a two-week extension, but by morning officials had already cut the supply."

Ganga canal upkeep hits city water supply

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NEW DELHI: Annual maintenance work on the Upper Ganga Canal has disrupted raw water supply to two of Delhi's key water treatment plants, senior Delhi Jal Board (DJB) officials said. The canal is currently undergoing routine repairs ahead of Diwali, which led to increased turbidity in the water.

The canal carries raw water to the Sonia Vihar and Bhagirathi water treatment plants which supply 140 MGD (million gallon per day) and 110 MGD water to parts of East Delhi,

North and South Delhi. These plants supply water to areas like Yamuna Vihar, Dilshad Garden, Gokulpuri, Jafrabad, and Karawal Nagar, among others.

A senior DJB official said that the operations of the plans have been curtailed over the last days. "We are facing issues due to the closure of the Upper Ganga Canal. We are diverting water from Yamuna to ensure that minimal impact is felt by the consumers," official added.

However, the official said that switching the water source has introduced increased turbidity and debris, further challenging treatment operations.

2/3rd of Southern Ridge will get full forest protection: CM

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NEW DELHI: Delhi chief minister Rekha Gupta on Monday said that nearly 40,100 hectares of the Southern Ridge will soon be notified and protected as a reserved forest under section 20 of the Indian Forest Act, 1927. This move will grant full legal protection to two-thirds of the 6,200-hectare Southern Ridge.

While the Southern Ridge has been notified under section 4 — which grants initial protection, but for full legal protection, a notification under section 20 is

required. The final notification has been pending since 1996.

Officials said the file will be sent to the Lieutenant Governor for approval. Once cleared, a gazette notification will follow to formalize the status.

The CM said the move was a major step in protecting Delhi from pollution and strengthening the environment in a sustainable manner, adding that native species will be planted on open land in these forests.

She criticised previous administrations for neglecting the ridge's protection. "Several parts of the ridge were

encroached. For over 20 years, no action was taken," she said.

She also said that the current move is the first phase of a broader plan to secure all of Delhi's Ridge areas.

Meanwhile, Sirsa also held a review meeting on the city's tree transplantation practices, directing the forest department to empanel only expert agencies with advanced machinery and technical competence. "Past records show low survival rates of trees. With verified technical competence, we can now expect a visible improvement in tree transplantation," he said.
